- Legal systems
 - Common law
 - Civil (or Code) law
 - Religious law

- Jurisdiction

Presenting Evidence in Court

- Mindset
 - Tech – code works or doesn't
 - Background and documentation irrelevant
 - Legal – complex
 - Preparation
 - Background
 - Documentation
 - Law
 - See it from the other perspective

Presenting Evidence in Court

- Types:
 - Direct (witness statement)
 - Real (tangible object)
 - Documentary (this is us)
 - Demonstrative (this is CSI)

Presenting Evidence in Court

- Documentary
 - Hearsay
 - Backup testimony
 - How created
 - How handled
 - Any deviations, and why

Presenting Evidence in Court

- Rules
 - Relevant
 - Admissibility (reliability)
 - Chain of evidence/custody
 - Legality
 - “Best”

Presenting Evidence in Court

- Digital fragility

■ DO NOT MUCK IT UP!!

- If you change it, there is no way to say what was changed, by whom, what was the original, and whether it was important
- If changed, your “evidence” is worthless

Presenting Evidence in Court

- Expert witness
 - Opinion
 - US – Daubert
 - Judge decides skill, training, experince
 - Bias unimportant
 - UK
 - No possible bias

Presenting Evidence in Court

- Presentation (demonstrative, remember?)
 - Preparation
 - Audience
 - Relevance
